



# SLT


## What is SLT

- SLT is a coordination model for local, preventive measures against drugs and crime.
- SLT ensures cooperation between the resources that already exist in the municipality and the police to ensure optimal coordination of efforts and make all entities work towards a common goal.




## Challenges

- What are the biggest challenges for young people in your community?
- Which ones are particularly vulnerable with respect to heading down the wrong path?
- How may combined efforts help these youths cope with life's challenges and difficulties without turning to drugs and crime?
- SLT model is developed by KRÅD – The Norwegian National Crime Prevention Council, to help Norwegian municipalities use their resources more effectively facing these challenges.




## **Children and youths are primary target groups**

- SLT is mainly targeted towards children, youths and their parents and guardians.
- The objective is to provide the municipal children and youths the right type of help at the right time, a support system that work well across agencies and disciplines.




## History

- SLT model was introduced in Norway by KRÅD early 1990`s, based on the Danish SSP model
- It is an established truth that crime yields an enormous financial and human cost on the society. Effective mitigating measures are investments that eventually will give significant returns in terms of healthier, safer and more vibrant communities.
- Still, one often sees that prevention efforts are not provided the necessary resources, making full utilization of available resources even more important. This is what the SLT model is all about.




## Coordination

- The SLT model is established to coordinate the knowledge, expertise and resources of the police and those local authorities that has aspects of crime prevention on the agenda. It also includes two other important aspects of the community: businesses and private organizations.
- All of these meet regularly to exchange knowledge and experiences, get to know each other's working methods and cultures and to coordinate actions and assignments. This makes it easier to provide targeted prevention in a more efficient manner.
- When signals are captured and disseminated quickly, proper efforts are initiated earlier and more accurately - while the risk of duplicated or overlapping work is reduced.
- This is key in SLT model . This is also in line with the increasingly clear standards of knowledge autonomous decisions, both in the police and in other services.




## SLT local challenges and efforts in Sandnes

  - people with different backgrounds and positions come together through these safety and security walks which gives them an opportunity to discuss important questions regarding the well being of the population




## *The safety and security walk*



## The objective of the Safety and security walk

- Shared understanding of the responsibility for preventing violence and and crime
- Strengthens dialogue between various participants towards preventing substance crime and abuse
- Reveals need for physical changes in areas of the community
- Contributes to raising awareness regarding crime prevention



## Conclusion

- The walk has shown that Sandnes for the most is a safe city, but that maintenance is clearly needed
- Most of the tasks on the “action list” are regarding areas with low illumination
- The walk has proven to be an adequate tool to reveal challenges that has a negative impact of the perception of safety within the city




## ***Preventing extremism***


- Sandnes municipality has developed a guide to preventing radicalization in our local community. The information within these guidelines comprises a variety of facts, concepts, action plans, literature, links and contacts, tips on warning signs, clarification of these signs and possible measures to take going forward in the event an individual is radicalized.
- The guide describes an action trail - from concern to action, from local and relatively simple measures to heavier interdisciplinary cooperation with relevant stakeholders.



## ***Youth follow up***

- Young offenders between 15-18 years who have committed one or more criminal acts, may be subject to a follow-up program as an alternative to jail if it is considered that such close monitoring may prevent new future crimes.
- After the offender and guardian has consented, prosecutors determines whether the youth follow-up is a proper reaction for the youth. This may only be offered for offences with a maximum sentencing of 1 year.
